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POST-OPERATIVE OUTCOME IN ELECTIVE SURGERIES

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Objectives: To describe the incidence of adverse events in the post-operative (PO) period of elective plastic surgeries. **Methodology:** This is a prospective, observational, and descriptive real-life study conducted in a single hospital center. A total of 499 patients were included in the sample, who submitted to plastic surgeries from June to November 2017, performed exclusively by members of the Brazilian Society of Plastic Surgery – SBCP. The adverse events description concerning to the post-operative period was made through data obtained by the phone survey on the 7th and 30th PO days. **Results:** There was a low rate of identified adverse events (1.9%), without statistically significant correlation among local and systemic symptoms reported through the phone survey in the 7th PO and 30th PO days, neither with the size of the surgeries performed (p>0.05). There were no deaths and no severe adverse events in the present series. **Conclusion:** This study produced reliable results allowing the description of the low occurrence of adverse events and the importance of active search after hospital discharge.
